Who needs to be tested?

Universal

- Federal rules require blood lead testing of all Medicaid children at ages 1 and 2 years old and 3 to 6 year olds if they have not been previously tested.
- Lead test required for all Head Start children prior to enrollment.
- Discuss lead risk exposure as part of the first prenatal visit. Per CDC & ACOG recommendations, test when a single risk factor is identified.

Targeted

- All other children should be screened with the Lead Risk Assessment Questionnaire.
- Refugee children 6 months to 16 years of age should be tested upon arrival and within 6 months of finding stable housing.
- Internationally adopted children should be tested upon arrival, and again at 1 & 2 years of age.

- CPT Code 83655, Blood Lead
- Private Insurance: ~ \$13.00
- Medicaid: <u>~ \$13.00</u>
